


## **Block of the month May 2014** (15 x15 cm) **'Double sided Log Cabin 5'**

At our website, this block is also available as an EQ7 project.



The block of the month (May 2014) is a foundation pattern, but you can also sew it the traditional way. When making a double sided Log Cabin, take a  $17 \times 17$  cm piece of fiberfill. Draw the block on teabag paper (TB). Draw next to each line a dotted line so you know where to put your fabric. Sew with a seam allowance of 7 mm.

- Cut all pieces with a 7mm seam allowance. Cut a right piece and a reverse piece! (the backside is mirrored)
- Put the TB pattern at the fiberfill.
- Put piece A1 with right side up at the fiberfill, just inside the dotted lines.
- Put A2 on top of A1, right side down. Use the dotted line as a guideline. Pin together.
- Mark the dotted line with pins, so you can seen them at the backside.
- Turn the whole piece upside down and put A1 and A2 at the same place on the backside. (At the backside, the pieces are mirrored)
- Pin together all the layers and sew 7mm next to the outside between A1 and A2.
- Fold open both pieces A2 (front and back side)
- Put A3 at both sides on top of A2, pin together. The fabric will be larger than the line because of the seam allowance.
- Sew next to the outside of the A3 pieces and fold open.
- Do this with all the pieces.
- Sew the blocks together as 'Quilt as you go'-blocks.

In our Quiltshop, this year you'll get with every purchase the blocks of the month from the theme 'Flowers'. As always, these blocks are  $15 \times 15$  cm, so you can easily combine them with the blocks of the previous years. These blocks (2004-2010) are published in (Dutch) books, which you can order at our website.
